

# URING the Second World War, the British Crown Colony of Hong Kong was destined to be the first place the Canadian Army fought a land battle against the Axis powers...

From 8-25 December, 1941, almost 2,000 Canadian soldiers from Quebec City and Winnipeg fought a desperate battle against a much larger invading Japanese army that had total command of both sea and air. When the British Colony surrendered on Christmas Day, 290 Canadians had been killed and nearly 500 wounded.

Another **264** would go on to die in brutal Japanese captivity.

### WHY HONG KONG...?

During the early part
of the war Canada's main
participation had been
primarily its Navy and Air

Force... The Army had not seen any action so far.

That all changed in mid 1941 when Britain requested military assistance in the Far East to help deter Japanese aggression.

The Canadian Government rapidly agreed to send two infantry battalions to Hong Kong; The Winnipeg Grenadiers and The

weeks later they would be at war!

On Monday 8, December the Japanese struck... First, they bombed Kai Tak, the Colony's only airfield then other military installa-

tions. Within 5 days they had occupied *Kowloon* and the *New Territories* and were poised to assault *Hong Kong Island* itself...

### **VALOUR & SACRIFICE**

In a brief feature like this it is impossible to tell the full story of the *Battle of Hong Kong* and the numerous examples of bravery by the gallant defenders.

Japanese troops had surrounded the 'Winnipeggers' and were lobbing grenades into the Canadian position. On numerous occasions Company Sergeant Major John Osborn, a WW1 veteran, picked up the live grenades and threw them back at the enemy.

When one fell where Osborn could not reach it in time, he shouted a warning to his men and then threw himself on the grenade to smother the explosion. He was killed instantly but his sacrifice saved the lives of several of his comrades.

CSM Osborn was posthumously awarded the Victoria Cross, the British Empire's highest military award for gallantry in the field.

### **K&C's CANADIANS**

King & Country is proud to produce a squad of 6 fighting Canadian infantrymen in two small sets as they appeared in Hong Kong during those dark days of 1941.


Together, they represent a tribute in miniature to those brave Canadians who fought and died defending Hong Kong.

towards the town itself.

Back in Britain, plans began to take shape to evacuate at least a small portion of the Army amidst the chaos and confusion of the battle in France.

At the Admiralty in London, Vice Admiral Bertram Ramsay was put in charge of the seaborne operation given the code name; "Operation Dynamo".

From his headquarters at Dover, on the South coast of England, it would be his job to find the ships and boats of all shapes and sizes, both naval and civilian, that could perform this seemingly impossible task.

Over the coming days and nights Ramsay and his Royal Navy officers and men would fulfill this 'impossible task' to a degree that no one, including

#### AN OFT-TOLD TALE

The story of 'The Miracle of Dunkirk' has been told many times in books, documentaries and feature films, most notably in the recent Christopher Nolan epic, "DUNKIRK"...

Only one toy soldier company, however, KING & COUNTRY, has helped to tell the story of 'The Fall of France' and 'the Dunkirk Evacuation' in miniature.

Here, in this feature you can see the very special diorama display created by Gordon & Andy Neilson that formed the centre-piece of the K&C Room at the recent 'Chicago Show'.

Measuring 48'' X 24'', the display featured British 'Tommies'

and French 'Poilus' forming up and boarding a small fishing trawler berthed alongside a jetty somewhere in the French port city.

Ample use of K&C's own French Town facades make a perfect backdrop for the evacuation scene. Also shown are a few, soon-to-beabandoned military vehicles as well unfortunate civilian some refugees who found themselves caught up among the thousands of khaki-clad figures attempting to escape the advancing Germans.

> All of these elements come together to capture a small dramatic moment in history that changed the course of the Second World War and the fates of all the nations concerned.



### ABOUT THAT FISHING BOAT...

One question that came up time and time again in Chicago and afterwards was and is, "Where did you find that fishing boat in the diorama?"



Andy responds, "The wooden, 1:30 scale craft was a gift from a model ship company in China that made some items for us in the past... WW2 landing craft and Chinese Junks to be precise".

It had been sitting in K&C's Hong Kong head office for a few years until Andy decided to use it in the display.

"In the recent "DUNKIRK' movie there is a fishing boat that features prominently in the story. Why not," Andy explains, "convert our sample for use in a dockside scene".

To that end the boat had its lower hull cut off, making it a 'waterline



model' with lots of extra details added... British Army backpacks, discarded weapons and all kinds of supplies, boxes, fuel cans and assorted other loose items were spread all over the vessel as well as on the nearby dockside jetty.

Finally, the boat itself was 'weathered' to give it an authentic wartime feel along with special codes and numbers which were added to both port and starboard sides of the hull. A few stray bullet holes were the last addition.

King & Country Workshop's Gordon C. Neilson, has the last word. "I love helping to tell a story in miniature... and 'DUNKIRK' has been one of the best to both build and tell!"









### **ABOUT THE FIGURES**

At the top of the page opposite you can see *Riefenstahl* in her typical pose watching over two of her cameramen as they get down to work.

Among her camera crew at *Nuremberg* were several who were 'seconded' to her from the *SA* themselves, hence the brownshirt uniform.

Also in attendance is a **HJ** (Hitlerjugend) 'Clapper-Boy' volunteer.

Among the many thousands of **SA** men marching and parading in front of the Fuhrer was one notable



infatuated with Hitler in the early 1930's and soon came to the *Fuhrer's* attention as well as that of propaganda chief *Josef Goebbels*.

In 1933, she was chosen personally by Hitler to direct 'The Victory of Faith' (Der Sieg des Glaubens), a visual record of the 1933 Nuremberg Party Rally...

After the success of that it was almost preordained that she would direct a follow-up the next year. This

After its huge impact she was selected once more by Hitler personally to direct and produce 'Olympia', the film of the 1936 Berlin Olympics.

would become 'Triumph of the Will'.



absentee... Horst Wessel, this notorious Party stalwart had already been long dead for four years...! Assassinated in 1930 by two communists in Berlin, he was memorialized in words and music with the Nazi anthem, the 'Horst-Wessel Lied' (the Horst Wessel song) which, after 1933, became almost a second national anthem alongside 'Deutschland uber alles' (Germany Over All).

If not physically present at Nuremberg he was certainly 'spiritually' on parade with his Nazi comrades as they marched and greeted their Fuhrer.

### ALSO ON PARADE ...

In 'Triumph of the Will' another important Nazi organization is also on show... The Reich Labour Service (Reichsarbeitsdienst, RAD).

This was a mass disciplined unit established by the Nazis to help mitigate the effects of unemployment on the German economy, militarise the workforce and indoctrinate it with Nazi ideology.

The **RAD** conscripted young men

between the ages of 18-25 to serve for six months before their compulsory military service. All personnel lived in barracks and wore a paramilitary uniform complete with Swastika brassard and just above, the RAD symbol, an arm badge in the shape of an upturned shovel blade.

On display here are *RAD* men in their typical 'at-ease' parade pose. Others will also be available including marching figures, a standard bearer with the *RAD* banner and a reissue of **Konstantin Hierl**, the Reich Labour Leader (*Reichsarbeitsfuhrer*)...

### THE RISE & FALL OF LENI RIEFENSTAHL

Helene Bertha Amalie 'Leni' Riefenstahl (1902-2003) was a German film director, producer, screenwriter, photographer and actress. She broke into films originally as an actress in 1925 before directing her first feature in 1932.

Like many Germans she became

She continued to work throughout WW2 and, according to her own account, even became aware of Nazi war crimes and German atrocities which, she said later, made her ashamed of her earlier glorification of the regime.

#### **POST 1945**

After the war Leni Riefenstahl attempted to distance herself further from her very successful 'Nazi' past with distinctly mixed results... She was investigated by the German authorities on no less than four separate occasions and eventually turned to 'still' and 'underwater photography' publishing a number of books in the 1970's and 1980's.

Never again however was she able to regain her prominent position in the German cinematic community. She could never escape her 'National Socialist' past...

She died in Germany, on 8 September 2003, just a few weeks after her 101st birthday.

"SAVING PRIVATE RYAN" is one of the iconic War Films depicting an important part of the Normandy Invasion of June 6, 1944... and events in the days following it.

Directed by Steven Spielberg, it tells the story of a squad of U.S. Army Rangers on a dangerous mission behind enemy lines tasked to find the lone surviving brother whose three other brothers have all been killed in combat.

and became friends with Capt. Dale Dye USMC ret'd., the military advisor on "Saving Private Ryan" and many other major war films and television series. Andy presented Capt. Dye with the very first 2 x sets of

K&C D.DAY figures... U.S. Army Rangers and Airborne Paratroopers directly inspired by the movie... and Dale Dye's own work on it. Thus began a long friendship that continues to this day.

The 'lone survivor' is an American 101st. Airborne paratrooper missing somewhere deep in German-held Normandy.

When released in 1998 the film won great critical and public acclaim for its often brutal but authentic depiction of men at war. Deservedly, it went on to win 5 Academy Awards and was a huge commercial success all over the world.

It also inspired KING & COUNTRY to begin its own D.DAY series of model soldiers

### 10 THINGS You might not have known about "SAVING PRIVATE RYAN"


- 1. THE FILM was actually 'shot' in chronological order, unlike most Hollywood movies. Director Spielberg chose that way so that the actors would feel like they were going through the same actual experience, minus the real bullets of course. At the same time, they would lose fellow soldiers (actors) along the way helping them to portray 'real' resentment towards Pvt. Ryan, who does not share the same journey with them.
- 2. 'PVT. RYAN' played by Matt Damon, did not have to attend the same Dale Dye 'Boot Camp' as the other actors... That was another source of resentment between him and the rest of the cast!
- 3. THE D.DAY landing beach scenes were all filmed in *Ireland* using almost 1,000 soldiers / reservists of the Irish Army. The French government alas would not give permission to film on the actual

4. ACTOR BILLY BOB THORNTON was originally offered the role of 'Ranger' Sergeant Mike Horvath played by Tom Sizemore. Thornton rejected the role as

Normandy beaches.

he has a fear of water and did not want to go onto any landing craft.

- 5. ROBIN WILLIAMS, the late comedian, suggested *Matt Damon* to Steven Spielberg for the role of **Pvt. James F. Ryan.** *Robin Williams* was also a big toy soldier collector.
- 6. BRYAN CRANSTON, the star of "Breaking Bad" plays a one-armed officer back at the Pentagon when the decision is made to try and rescue Pvt. Ryan.



7. TOM HANKS was actually 41 years old when he played *Capt. John Miller*. In reality, most WW2 U.S. Army captains would have been in the 26-30 age bracket.

**8. RAMELLE**, where the final battle takes place is totally fictitious... All other locations and objectives mentioned in the movie are factual.

9. APART from the 'Normandy' beach location mentioned earlier the rest of the movie was filmed at Hatfield, Hertfordshire, a former airfield and factory of the De Havilland Aircraft Company, now part of British Aerospace.

# BLOODY TARAWA

War II. Beginning on the 20th of November, 1943 it took place on the tiny Tarawa Atoll in the Gilbert Islands, a chain of sixteen atolls and coral islands about halfway between Papua New Guinea and Hawaii.

TARAWA was destined to be the first American offensive in the critical Central Pacific Region. It was also the first time in the Pacific War that the United States faced serious and sustained opposition to one of its amphibious landings as the troops were going ashore.

Previous landings had met little or no resistance to the initial beach

On tiny Tarawa however more than 4,500 Japanese soldiers and Korean labourers were well dug-in and supplied... and fought almost to the last man.

### HERE COME THE MARINES!

Opposing them and preparing to lead the assault were the officers and men of the **2nd**.





Marine Division, United States Marine Corps, some of America's best and toughest fighting forces. They were to face and overcome a fierce and determined enemy that gave 'no quarter' and expected none in return.

Within the space of just 76 hours the Marines of the 2nd Division were to lose just over 1,000 killed and over 2,100 wounded... Japanese casualties were much higher – Almost 4,500 killed and just 17 captured!

A terrible price to pay for a small but vital 'spit of coral sand' in the clear blue Pacific Ocean.

U.S. War Correspondent *Robert Sherrod*, who was on Tarawa with the Marines was to write later, "Last week some 2,000 or 3,000 United States Marines, most of them dead or wounded gave the nation another name to stand beside Concord Bridge... the Alamo... Little Bighorn... and Belleau Wood... The name was Tarawa!"

### **SEMPER FI... DO OR DIE!**

'SEMPER FIDELIS' (Always Faithful) is the proud motto of the United States Marine Corps and one that K&C's own co founder and former Royal Marine, Andy C. Neilson knows only too well...

"When I went through my Commando Course at Lympstone in Devon, the home of the Commando Training Centre Royal Marines, we had two U.S. Marines from the American Embassy in London complete it with us at the same time... They were great guys, tough as nails, and it was a real privilege to serve and train with them."

Since then K&C's creative director has made many good friends in the U.S.M.C. whenever they passed through Hong Kong. Andy continues to stay in touch and visit with several of them during his stateside visits to toy soldier shows and events all over the U.S.

"Perhaps that's one of the reasons why K&C has, over the years, produced so many U.S. Marine figures," Andy adds.

Ample proof of that can be seen in many of the photographs that illustrate this article. Alongside our very latest KING & COUNTRY Marines are representative figures from many past releases including K&C's original IWO JIMA series launched back in the late 1990's and its 'second edition' in 2005.

Also on view are a few of our 'China Marines' from our 'Sand Pebbles' series and even some Marines in parade dress representing the famous '8th and I Barracks' in Washington D.C.

Unfortunately, you cannot see some of the company's 'Vietnam Marines' also from the late 1990's early 2000's. These are extremely rare and hard to find today and frequently go for big bucks on the 'Secondary Market' and ebay!

### ABOUT OUR 'TARAWA' MARINES...

This past September in Chicago K&C launched our latest 'TARAWA' Marines representing those 'Leathernecks' who fought and died in the brutal, island-hopping campaign of the latter half of WWII.

These new Marines are, in the opinion of many collectors and dealers who saw them at the Chicago Show, the best and most dynamic ones yet! Initially 10 were released with regular 'add-ons' being produced almost every single month thereafter...

At the same time we have many more 'in the works' that will result in one of the most exciting ranges of all-action figures produced in the toy soldier world today!

### ARMOURED AMPHIBIOUS SUPPORT

It's not only foot-slogging 'Mud Marines' appearing on the beach and on the battlefield... We've also got some serious tracked backup for them in the shape of the awesome looking LVT-A1 'Alligator'. This was the first infantry support LVT (Landing Vehicle Track) with the 'A' standing for 'Armoured'. Mounting the turret-armed 37mm gun from the M3 Light Tank this 'Amtrac' also carried 2 x .30 caliber machine guns behind the turret.

These vehicles were intended to provide *close-in fire support* for the beach-assaulting Marines.









It was common, however, for these 'Alligators' to open fire with all their armament while still in the water!

Also on show in the Tarawa diorama spread is **KnC's** very own plastic and resin *M4 Sherman* complete with wading stacks... As you can see it has been custom-painted and suffered some serious battledamage.

Another featured vehicle is a very early 'Amtrac' made by BMC, the plastic toy soldier company. This model was directly based on K&C's own original polystone 'Amtrac' produced with our first IWO JIMA series in 1998... We sold the rights to BMC to reproduce that initial series in plastic. Again, however it was custom-painted by one of our own

King & Country 'master-painters' in Hong Kong.

The entire 'TARAWA' diorama was designed and built by K&C's Diorama Workshop and Andy's brother, Gordon C. Neilson.

FOR MANY WW2 armour enthusiasts the name 'Michael Wittmann' is best known for his famous ambush of leading elements of the British 7th Armoured Division, during the Battle of Villers-Bocage in Normandy on 13 June, 1944.

# Wittmann's Winter Tiger

Gun Carriers along with two anti-tank guns... All in the space of just 15 minutes!

With this spectacular feat of arms the Nazi propaganda machine ensured that Wittmann's fame spread far and wide and he became a leading military 'star' and hero of the Third Reich.



On that day, while in command of a *Tiger 1* tank, he and his crew destroyed up to *fourteen British tanks* plus *fifteen personnel carriers* and *Bren* 





### **AWARDS & HONOURS**

For his bravery, leadership and battlefield success Wittmann was awarded, on 14 January 1944, with the Knight's Cross of the Iron Cross. The presentation itself was made by divisional commander SS Oberfuhrer Theodor Wisch who originally nominated him for the Knight's cross with Oak Leaves.

Less than 3 weeks later the Oak Leaves were added to his award for the destruction of 117 enemy tanks while fighting on the Eastern Front.

Michael Wittmann had to journey all the way back from the front to meet Adolf Hitler personally at the 'Wolf's Lair' in Rastenburg, East Prussia at the beginning of February 1944 for the presentation.

Before Wittmann journeyed to meet the Fuhrer and in the depths of the Russian Winter one more set of 'congratulations' came about when Wittmann and his entire Tiger tank crew together with their vehicle were presented to SS Sturmbannfuhrer Jochen Peiper, himself one of the Waffen SS's most celebrated officers.

### SETTING THE SCENE

With the backdrop of Wittmann's own Tiger 1 'Command Tank' (note the 3 antenna) WS344 we see the figure of Jochen Peiper approaching the full crew of 'S04' led by Michael Wittmann himself.

With arm fully extended in the 'Hitler' salute the young tank commander greets his superior officer. In the photographs taken of the actual meeting Peiper is seen wearing the full all-black Panzer parade uniform as are the five other figures.

All six come together in a 'Special



### ABOUT THIS ALL-NEW WITTMANN WINTER TIGER

KING & COUNTRY'S latest **TIGER 1** (our  $12^{th}$ ) is the very first 'Command Tiger' we have produced... The 3 x antenna on the vehicle make it easily recognizable as the 'lead' vehicle of a troop of Tigers.

Also 'new' on this tank are the 2 x top turret hatches which can 'open and close' as the collector chooses.

The main 88 Gun also elevates The standard up and down. German camouflage of the period is also adopted however being a 'winter' tank a faded 'white wash' has also been added.

THE FATE OF MICHAEL WITTMANN

On 8 August 1944, British

'Operation

and Canadian forces

*Totalize'*. Under cover

launched

of darkness, Anglo-Canadian tanks seized the high ground around the small Normandy town of Saint-Aignan-de-Cramesnil. Here they paused while waiting the next phase of the operation.

Nearby Kurt Meyer, commanding the 12th SS Hitlerjugend Division ordered armoured elements of his command to counter attack and recapture the small town.

SS-Haupsturmfuhrer Michael Wittmann was given the task and led a group of 7 x Tiger tanks supported by other armour and infantry towards their objective.

As Wittmann's Tigers crossed some open terrain leading upwards towards the high ground they were ambushed by three different British and Canadian tank squadrons lying in wait alongside their route.

Attacked from different directions the Allied anti tank shells soon found their mark. Several direct hits were scored on Wittmann's tank including which alone one penetrated the Tiger's thick armour, igniting its ammunition and blowing the turret completely off the hull and onto a field next to it...

There were no survivors... Michael Wittmann and his crew were buried in an unmarked grave next to their stricken vehicle.

And that's where they would remain until 1983 when a German War Graves Commission Team located their remains and had them reinterred at the huge La Cambe *German War Cemetery* in Normandy.

This German tank 'ace' may be long-dead but his legend most definitely lives on!



# ointhe va fong long Regiment

SADLY, THE REGIMENT was disbanded back in 1995, just 2 years before Britain handed back Hong Kong to China.


